8. REPORT OF THE CABINET

The following matters were considered by Cabinet at its meeting on 18 June 2019 and Cabinet's recommendations are as set out below.

Honorary Freedom of the City	<p>The Cabinet recommends the Council to:-</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> (i) agree to the conferring, in accordance with the provisions of Section 249 of the Local Government Act 1972, of the Honorary Freedom of the City upon Jordan Henderson, and (ii) authorise the Chief Executive, in consultation with the Leader of the Council, to agree all appropriate arrangements for the formal ceremony at an extraordinary meeting of the Council.
Cabinet Report No. 2	Cabinet, 18 June 2019
Cross Border Taxi Licensing Enforcement	<p>The Cabinet approved that:-</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> (i) The Council enter into a Memorandum of Understanding with other local authorities in the north east region in order to facilitate cross border licensing enforcement with regard to hackney carriages and private hire vehicles that are being operated outside of the area of the local authority from which the relevant licences were obtained.

(ii) The form of the Memorandum of Understanding be in the form, or substantially in the form, of that set out in Appendix 1 to the report, subject to any amendments required or agreed by the Assistant Director of Law and Governance.

(iii) The Council enter into agreements under section 113 of the Local Government Act 1972 with the other authorities participating in the Cross Border Hackney Carriage and Private Hire Vehicle Authorisation Scheme for (a) the placing at the disposal of the other authorities for the purposes of the Scheme the services of licensing officers employed by the Council; and (b) the acceptance of the services of officers of those other participating authorities on a reciprocal basis.

(iv) The Executive Director of Neighbourhoods be authorised to take all steps necessary to implement the above and be given delegated power to authorise officers made available by other participating authorities to exercise taxi licensing enforcement powers within their respective areas on behalf of this Council.

Accordingly the Cabinet recommends the Council to agree provisions (i) to (iv) above in relation to any matters within the remit of the Scheme and the Memorandum of Understanding that are not functions of the Executive.
