

## East Area Committee Delivery Plan 2023 - 2026

## Updated June 2025

The Area Plan commits the Area Committee to a number of priorities, which will be delivered within the East of Sunderland. This Delivery Plan provides an update on progress on the Area Committee's Area Plan and will be monitored by the Area Committee and actions will be addressed throughout the next three years via the East Neighbourhood and Community Board

The response to subsequent call for projects to be discussed at July 2024 N&C Board meeting, the project will not be progressed at this time and the funding was returned to Area Committee in September 2024.

<ul> <li>Blue Watch Youth Centre - Ryhope - 2/3-hour sessions taking place throughout holiday periods providing around 900 places across 30 sessions for children and young people age 5-16 to participate in fun activities and receive a healthy meal</li> <li>The Box Youth and Community Project -Doxford – 30 sessions to take place over the 6 holiday periods providing around 370 places for CYP to take part in fun activities and trips</li> <li>Sunderland All Together Youth Consortium - Hendon – 32 sessions over the 6 holiday periods proving around 200 places for CYP to participate in onsite activities and trips to parks, beaches and the cinema</li> <li>Sunderland All Together Youth Consortium – Millfield – mixture of outdoor and centre based holiday clubs aimed at young people aged 7-16, expected to create around 700 places.</li> <li>CHANCE – Hendon –33 sessions over the six holiday periods, providing around 900 places for CYP to participate in fun activities and trips while also receiving a healthy meal</li> <li>Evolve Youth Inclusion– Hendon – Free Friday evening health and fitness sessions during school holidays for young people aged 9-16, funding will create around 560 places.</li> </ul>
<ul> <li>Sunderland Community Action Group - St Michael's- separate sessions for 4-10 and 11–16-year-olds taking place every Tuesday, Thursday and Friday throughout the holidays. Around 800 places will be available during holiday periods throughout the year.</li> </ul>
Two applications which were deferred pending further information were approved via the Responsive Local Decision process in February 2025 as follows:
<ul> <li>GEN D CIC - three digital art sessions per week during holiday times for young people aged 6-16, 725 spaces will be provided over 30 sessions.</li> </ul>

	<ul> <li>African Caribbean Community Association – Saturday morning football sessions to take place during school holiday times, each participant will receive a meal following the session, 11 sessions will be delivered during Easter, May and Summer, 375 places will be provided.</li> </ul>
	Area Committee will consider a recommendation to align funding to ensure a further year of delivery until September 2026 at the June Area Committee meeting under Item 4.
Projects that increase physical and wellbeing activities for young people and support healthier lifestyles and lessen the impact of the cost-of-living crisis	As outlined above, eight organisations across the East area delivered holiday activities for children and young people under the banner of 'Fancy a Day Out' during Summer holidays 2024, it was a condition of the funding that all participants received a healthy meal as part of each session.
	Members approved another seven projects at the September Area Committee on the same premise that children and young people participating will take part in physical and wellbeing activities and also receive a healthy meal. A further two projects were approved in February 2025.
	Through two rounds of East Can Do, East Area Committee have supported six young people led projects as follows:

The programme will build on the learning from the warm and welcoming spaces, ensuring we are able to offer services and support within our communities – support and activities which bring residents together, enable active engagement and improve health, wellbeing and financial resilience.

	Extension and Allocation for 2025/26
	In April 2025, the Area Committee, through a delegated decision, approved the continuation of the £15,000 per ward as part of the Ward Improvement Budget, funded through Neighbourhood Funding. This renewed funding is intended to maintain momentum in ward improvements and will continue to support projects that align with council priorities and contribute to the Area Committee's strategic objectives.
	To ensure effective allocation, each ward will be permitted to fund a maximum of three priority projects from their £15,000 budget, with careful selection to maximise the impact in the community

Supported community assets to develop, grow and sustain	Capital improvements to community centres – please see above Dedicated capacity building projects for Ryhope Community Association and St Michael's Community Centre – please see below Capacity building project for Doxford Park and District Community Association agreed at June Area Committee.
Improved the Stephenson Trail	Presentation from steering group shared. Environmental works have continued with way markers and information panels being installed during Autumn 2023. The steering group have extended current ward-based maintenance arrangements (Groundwork Northeast and Cumbria for Millfield and The Box Youth and Community Project for Doxford) for another two years commencing from Summer 2024. New signage detailing some interpretation information was installed in Autumn 2024 and a section of the Trail that runs between Eden Vale Road and Chester Road was also upgraded with path resurfacing and the cutting back of trees and shrubbery. A small length of redundant palisade fencing has been removed and the low-level wall reinstated at St Mark's Road, this will serve to reduce the build up of litter and improve the overall appearance of the area.

Award of over £140,000 secured from The National Lottery to support the continuation of activities at the Ryhope Community Centre over the next three years.
