


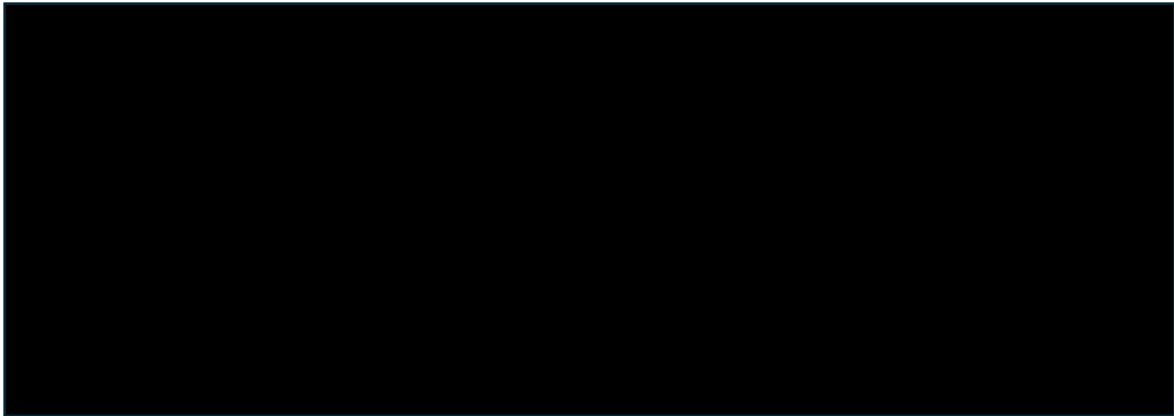
Redactions

What are redactions and why do we do it? Redactions are marks in a document that permanently remove text that you are not entitled to receive. This is usually because it relates to another person, or because we consider that an exemption applies.

They look like this in the document 

There might also be a full page missing if none of the information on that page is relevant to your request. This means the page numbers might show missing pages.

There might be large sections of information redacted that will look like this.



The information you receive might also be handwritten if it relates to older records; this might be difficult to read, or very faint.
