Universal Credit key messages

From 25 July **new claims** for most benefits/tax credits for **working age people** in Sunderland will usually be for Universal Credit.

Check UC is the right benefit for you.

You do not need to claim UC otherwise until the Department for Work and Pensions tell you to claim.

Universal Credit – the facts

- Universal Credit will be paid directly into your bank account
- 2 You'll get one monthly payment for your whole household
- Your payment may be different each month depending on your income, for example, change in wages
- Any help you get with your rent will be included in your payment
- You'll have to pay your landlord yourself
- Most people will claim Universal Credit online.
- You can apply for an **Advance Payment** to help you manage until you get your first payment

- Get the right bank account you will need one to get paid
- 2 Draw up a budget
- Set up an email address you will need one to make a claim
- Find your national insurance number you will need one to make a claim
- **£** Get online to manage your claim
 - Find out where you can get online
 - Improve your online skills if you don't feel very confident

- Don't delay
- f need help to make an online claim

Contact the UC Helpline for free on 0800 328 5644 (Monday to Friday 8am-6pm)

- Have all the information you need
 - ID
 - Proof of your income, your rent and landlord information
- Apply for Council Tax Support you have to make a separate claim
- Apply for an **Advance Payment** to help you manage until you get your first payment
- Help is available with free school meals

- Trouble managing your housing payments?
 - Ask your Work Coach about Alternative Payment Arrangements
 - Talk to your Housing Provider/Landlord
- Sanctioned?
 - Seek advice
 - Apply for a hardship payment
- Struggling to Budget

Ask your Work Coach about Personal Budgeting Support

- Get some help with digital skills to manage UC online requirements
- Seek help if you are feeling anxious or depressed about your situation

To keep receiving your benefits you must...

£ Attend your appointments

Remember you must attend your face to face appointment with DWP

Keep to your claimant commitment

You must keep to the terms of your claimant commitment – failure could result in your payments stopping

Report any changes

In your household's circumstances via your online account as they happen

E Keep your online account up to date

Remember DWP will use your online account as a way to contact you

Universal Credit – get help

- If you think a Department for Work and Pensions decision is incorrect Speak to the DWP or see your local advice provider
- If you have no money whilst waiting for your first payment, apply for an Advance Payment
- f you are struggling due to other reasons
 - Apply for crisis support (help with food/fuel)
 - Contact your local food bank
- f you are struggling to manage your budget
 - Ask your Work Coach about Personal Budgeting Support
 - See a local advice provider about debt issues
 - If you have been on UC for six months, you could apply for a Budgeting Advance
- Seek help if you are feeling anxious or depressed about your situation
