Sunderland City Council can support local businesses to train apprentices by transferring its unspent apprenticeship levy to employers.

Apprenticeship Levy Transfer Scheme

Sunderland City Council can support employers in the city by funding the training and assessment costs of new apprenticeship starts.

Receiving organisations must either be non-levy payers or have fully committed their own levy funds in order to apply for additional funds. The levy transfer can be used to train an existing employee or a new recruit.

The council is keen to support Level 3 Apprenticeships or above in key sectors of the economy which lead to skilled and well-paid employment. This can include staff with a higher lever qualification who are eligible to receive apprenticeship training at a lower level in a different subject area.

We would particularly welcome applications from co-operatives and social enterprises.

Recipient organisations must be located within the Sunderland City Council local authority area and be engaged in one of four priority sectors:

- Engineering and Manufacturing
- Digital and Creative
- Health, Wellbeing and Social Care
- Financial and Customer Services

The scheme is now live and has supported several companies in the city, both large and small.
